## Columbia County Receives Agricultural Disaster Assistance Declaration

ST. HELENS--Columbia County farmers are eligible for disaster assistance from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) for potential losses from last December's freezing temperatures.

USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack approved a disaster declaration request from Washington County on August 2<sup>nd</sup> for damage to crops from low temperatures that occurred between December 1<sup>st</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, 2009. Due to the way the USDA disaster declaration process works, farmers in counties contiguous to Washington County are also eligible, making the declaration applicable to Columbia County.

According to Derek White, Columbia County Emergency Management Director, "This declaration opens up certain types of disaster assistance related to agricultural losses, and farmers can apply for assistance from the Farm Service Agency". "That assistance, if the applicant is eligible, ranges from emergency loans to supplemental revenue assistance payments", White says.

Farmers have until April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2011 to apply. Assistance applications must be filed at the nearest Farm Service Agency (FSA) office, which is located at:
